Resource Fee

You will need to pay your £25 non-refundable Resource Fee before coming to enrol. This can be done on the online shop <u>Wiltshire College Online Shop</u> You will need to bring a copy of your receipt to enrolment as proof of purchase. If you cannot pay online, please pay by card on enrolment day.

Stationery

Uniform & PPE

All students are required to have specific clothing and PPE, which must be worn in all practical sessions. More information on how to order this from our supplier will be added soon – we will email you when this is available to view.

We do not provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and this must be purchased before you start your course. If PPE is not present at the start of term, this may exclude you from ALL practical sessions.

For Health and Safety reasons NO visible piercings are permissible during practical activities. All jewellery must be removed including necklaces and rings and long hair must be tied back.

It is also advised not to have nail extensions or false nails as this could cause injury to animals or yourself. Please be aware no hoodies are permissible for practical sessions.

Students are required to purchase from the online shop:

- Steel toe cap boots, walking boots or wellies and appropriate trousers are also required in practical sessions.
